

FINAL DECLARATION

The Hungarian Youth Conference held its 32nd regular meeting on May 12-14, 2017 in Lendava.

The Hungarian Youth Conference was attended by Dr. Boglárka Illés, Deputy State Secretary for Youth Policy and Chance Creation, Ministry of Human Resources, dr. Péter Szilágyi, Deputy State Secretary for National Policy, State Secretary of the Ministry of National Affairs, Judit Vida Törnar, Chairman of the Lendva County Hungarian National Self-Government Community, and Aleksandra Kozak, Secretary of the Commune of Lendva

The Hungarian Youth Conference welcomes the increase in the number of first graders enrolled in Hungarian schools in Highland.

The Hungarian Youth Conference notes with regret that according to the first instance decision of the High Court of Novi Sad, Vamadis lost the lawsuit against the Faculty of Law for the Hungarian entrance examination. Our organization supports the court process to be continued at second instance.

We welcome that the Government of Hungary has launched an economic development program similar to Voivodina in Zakarpattya. Please be more accessible to start-up young entrepreneurs within the framework of current economic applications and start-up programs. We are pleased to learn that in the near future new foreign community spaces will be opened.

The Hungarian Youth Conference is concerned about the phenomena that occur during the preparation of the celebration in relation to the 100th anniversary of the adoption of the Gyulaféhevár Declaration. We ask the Hungarian Government to follow the events so that commemoration does not have the stigmatizing remarks of the Hungarian community.

The recognition of the innovative power of young Hungarian researchers and the support of their use are considered by the Hungarian Youth Conference as a key issue for the future maintenance of Hungarian cultural, scientific and economic communities. It is inevitable to cooperate with the young research community in the mother country and abroad, to maintain and develop a common scientific space.

In the session of the Hungarian Youth Conference, a proposal package was created to increase the public activity in the youth as well as to strengthen the national identity. This proposal package is attached to this statement.

The next Session of the Hungarian Youth Conference will be held in Hungary.

On 13 May 2017, the members of the Section "Community and Politics (Community Activity, Hungarian Identity)" agreed on the following consensus:

"In our opinion, the integration of young people can be achieved and their interest in public life supported not only through party-political programs, but through community experiences and activities.

We feel it necessary in the communication to young people to raise awareness and emphasize that politics is not against them, but much rather for them and they have a say in them.

We consider it necessary to involve the local government more actively in the process of promoting public life to young people.

It is important to have more time in secondary education to increase the civic and financial knowledge of young people during high school. We recommend the organization of interactive and illustrative programs during the extra time (visiting local public institutions, meeting with politicians, etc.)

We consider it important to create opportunities for young people in higher education and post high school to deal with public issues and to get acquainted with political and political youth organizations. We want to do all this the way ensuring that the independence of educational institutions is not compromised.

We encourage stronger involvement of local cultural and public educational institutions in the process of strengthening the national awareness of young people

We support any initiative that is conducive to nationally important historical events in the 21st century. (E.g. the production of films and series of shows demonstrating certain eras of the Hungarian history, the development of such themed computer games or applications, or the more frequent appearance of traditions or military traditions)."
